**1. Jesus Shares God's Life With Us**

Blessed Trinity - Three persons in one God: God the father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit,

Jesus' mission - to share the life of God with all people and to save them from sin  
Kingdom of God - is the power of God's love active in our lives and in the world  
Apostles - 12 men who shared Jesus mission and would continue Jesus saving work.

Church - all those who believe in Jesus Christ, have been baptized in him, and follow his teachings

**2. Jesus Share His mission with the Church**

Evangelization - proclaiming the good news of Christ by what we say and do.

Liturgy - the official public prayer of the Church

Paschal Mystery - Christ's passion and death, Resurrection from the dead and Ascension into heaven

Last judgement - Jesus coming at the end of time to judge all people

Corporal Works of Mercy - act of love that help us care for the physical and material needs of others.

Spiritual Works of Mercy - acts of love that help us care for the needs of people hearts, minds, and souls.

**3. The Church Celebrates Seven Sacraments**

Sacrament - an effective sign given to us by Jesus through which we share God's life

Sanctifying grace - the gift of sharing in God's life.

Christian Initiation - the process of becoming a member of the Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Common vocation - the call to holiness and evangelization that all Christians share.

Holiness - sharing in God's goodness and responding to his love by the way we live our lives; our holiness comes through grace.

**4. New Life in Christ**

Baptism - the sacrament in which we are freed from sin, become children of God, and are welcomed into the Church.

Incarnation - the truth that the Son of God became man.

Salvation - the forgiveness of sins and the restoring friendship with God.

Prophet - someone who speaks on behalf of God, defends the truth, and works for justice

Eternal life - living in happiness with God forever.

Saints - followers of Christ who lived lives of holiness on earth and now share in eternal life with God in heaven

**5. The Celebration of Baptism**

Catechumenate - a period of formation for Christian initiation that includes prayer and liturgy, religious instruction, and service to others.

Chrism - perfumed oil blessed by the bishop.  
water, white garment, oil, lighted candle - signs of Baptism

## **8. The Coming of the Holy Spirit**

Confirmation – sacrament in which we receive the Gift of the Holy Spirit in a special way

Pentecost – day the Holy Spirit came upon the first disciples

Laying on of hands and anointing – signs of God's blessing

## **9. The Celebration of Confirmation**

Gifts of the Holy Spirit – wisdom, understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, and wonder and awe

## **10. Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life**

Passover – the feast on which Jewish people remember the miraculous way that God saved them from death and slavery in ancient Egypt.

Eucharist – the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus is truly present under the appearances of bread and wine

Sacrifice – a gift offered to God by a priest in the name of all people

Real presence – Jesus really and truly present in the Eucharist

Last Supper – Holy Thursday,

## **11. The Celebration of the Eucharist**

Introductory Rites – the part of the Mass that unites us as a community. It prepares us to hear God's word and to celebrate the Eucharist

Liturgy of the Word – the part of the Mass in which we listen and respond to God's word; we profess our faith and pray for all people in need

Liturgy of the Eucharist – the part of the Mass in which the death and resurrection of Christ are made present again. Our gifts of bread and wine become the Body and Blood

of Christ, which we receive in Holy Communion.

Consecration – the part of the Eucharistic prayer when, by the power of the Holy Spirit and through the words and actions of the priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

Concluding rites – dismissal – the last part of the Mass in which we are blessed and sent forth to be Christ's servants in the world and to love others as he had loved us.

## **12. Living As a Prayerful People**

Liturgy of the Hours – public prayer of the Church made up of psalms, readings from Scripture and Church teaching, prayers and hymns, celebrated at various times during the day.

Holy day of obligation – a day we are obliged to participate in the Mass to celebrate a special event in the life of Jesus, Mary or the saints.

The Lord's Prayer --

Sacramentals – used in liturgy and personal prayer (blessings, rosaries, medals, sign of the cross)
