Solomon – He gradually forgot the covenant and followed the ways of many false Gods.

Because of this God told Solomon that he would take the Kingdom away from him.

Idolatry - giving worship to a creature or thing instead of to God

The Northern Kingdom - After the division of Solomon's kingdom, the northern kingdom of 10 tribes under King Jeroboam was known as Israel

The Southern Kingdom - After the division of Solomon's kingdom, the southern kingdom of 2 tribes under King Rehoboam was known as Judah

Assyrians – Assyrians Filled the Northern Kingdom with peoples from other lands. Over 27000

Israelites – The Israelites were deported and never heard from again. They became known as the 10 lost tribes of Israel.

Prophets - someone who speaks on behalf of God, defends the truth, and works for justice

Vocation - God's call to serve him in a special way

Blasphemy - a thought, word, or act that refers to God without respect or reverence

Exile -refers to the time when the Jewish people were in Babylon

Lamentation - a sorrow that is expressed in the form of a poem

Superstition - the false belief that living creatures or things possess powers that in fact they do not have

hope - enables us to trust in God's promise to be with us always.

proverb - a brief saying that gives wise advice

Torah - the Hebrew name for the first five books of the Old Testament

Wisdom - the knowledge and ability to recognize and follow God's will in our lives

Parable - short story that has a message

Providence - God's plan for and protection of all creation

Hanukkah - The Jewish feast of Hanukkah, also called the “feast of lights,” celebrates the cleansing and rededication of the Temple by Judas Maccabeus.

Incarnation - the truth that the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, became man

Angel Gabriel - The angel that told Mary that she and Elizabeth would be mothers.

John the Baptist – Was born to prepare the people for the messiah.

Kingdom of God - the power of God's love coming into the world and into our lives
