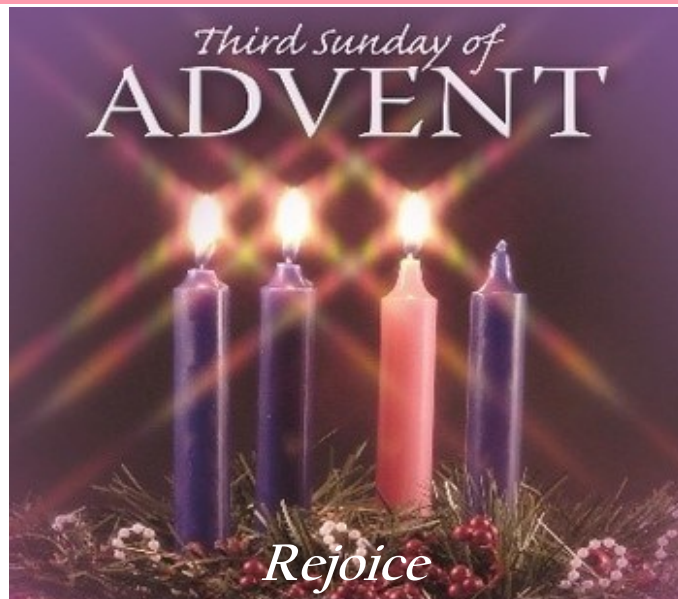

Participation in the baptismal preparation program is required if this is your first child or the first child being baptized at St. Pius X. The program is held on the second Friday of the month.

Reconciliation:

Thursdays 5:30 - 6:30 PM and Saturdays 3:00 - 3:45 PM. You may also call the rectory for an appointment.

First Eucharist and Confirmation:

A two year preparation program is required. Please call Faith Formation Office (508)394-0709.

Ministry to the Sick:

Please notify the Parish Office if someone would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick at home or is unable to attend Mass due to illness, handicap or age. Holy Communion can be brought to them.

Matrimony:

Couples are asked to contact the Parish Office at least eight months in advance of the anticipated wedding date to allow adequate time for marriage preparation, including the Diocesan Preparation Program.

Advent: Week III! It is Gaudete Sunday. Rejoice Sunday! We hear the call of St. John the Baptist again. This time he is in prison wondering if Jesus is the one who is to come? The question is answered well by Jesus himself. "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them." This Christ is the fulfillment of all God's words proclaimed by Isaiah the prophet! But John too is a messenger of God pointing to this Messiah in word and deed! So even in the various "prisons" of our lives there is Christ to give us hope! Let us remember the "WORDS" of weeks one and two: Awake, Aware, and Ready: Amazing, and Surprising. Can we make this week Joy and Hope?

The Third Candle is lit this weekend as we mark the time of Advent before Christmas. It is a Rose Colored Candle that reminds us through the Entrance Antiphon. "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say, rejoice. The Lord is near." Philippians 4: 4-5. We use the Sgt. Sean Gannon wreath as a reminder of how he gave his all to protect us. This wreath was once lit by him when he was my altar server at St. Francis Xavier in Acushnet. This week we are reminded to rejoice because the Lord is near.

**THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT
THE JESSE TREE**

The following symbols, representing the Old Testament people who prepared for the coming of Christ, will be placed on the Jesse Tree.

DAVID: Refer to Samuel 16:1-13; 17:32-51. David was the son of Jesse and a direct ancestor of Jesus. David was a Shepherd from Bethlehem who slew the giant, Goliath. He became the King of Israel. Jesus, a descendent of David, will inherit David's kingdom, becoming the Good Shepherd and the King of Kings. Symbols: Star of David and sheep.

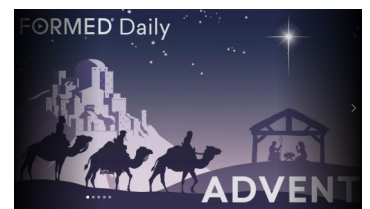
SOLOMON: Refer to 1 Kings, chapter 5. Solomon was the son of David who became King after David. Solomon was known for his wealth and wisdom. He built the Temple of Jerusalem for worship. Symbol: Crown.

PROPHETS: The prophets were the teachers and each one in a different way foretold the coming of the Messiah and prepared the people for Christ's coming. Each prophet of the Old Testament is represented on the Jesse Tree by the prophet's name written on a scroll. The prophets are Isaiah, Jeremiah, Baruch, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi. Refer to Isaiah, Chapter 60. Symbol: Scroll.

Budget envelopes are not forwarded by the US Postal Service. Each winter the USPS returns a large number of these envelopes to the office. This is a big expense to our parish. Thank you - this saves us unnecessary postal costs!
