

WE BELIEVE

We bring forward the gifts of bread and wine.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the second main part of the Mass. During the Liturgy of the Eucharist we present the gifts of bread and wine. A very special prayer is prayed. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins as the priest prepares the altar. This is also the time when we give money or other gifts for the Church and the poor.

Then members of the assembly bring forward the gifts of bread and wine. We remember that everything we have is a gift from God. We will offer these gifts and ourselves back to God. The priest prepares these gifts of bread and wine with special prayers.

We can respond:

"Blessed be God for ever."

Then we pray that the Lord will accept these gifts.

A Gift From Your Children

Here is our gift, the bread and the wine: A symbol of sharing, a beautiful sign: A gift, a gift from your children; A gift, a gift of our love.

As Catholics...

The Church uses a special plate and cup at Mass. The plate is called a *paten*. The paten holds the bread that will become the Body of Christ. The cup is called a *chalice*. The chalice holds the wine that will become the Blood of Christ. The next time you are at Mass, notice the paten and chalice.

The Eucharistic Prayer is the great prayer of thanks and praise.

After the preparation of the gifts, the priest prays in our name. He prays the most important prayer in the Mass. This prayer is called the **Eucharistic Prayer**. It is the great prayer of praise and thanksgiving.

During this prayer we pray for many things. We praise God by singing "Holy, holy, holy. . . ." We remember what Jesus said and did at the Last Supper. The priest takes the bread. He says:

"TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU."

Then the priest takes the cup of wine. He says: "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood. . . ."



This part of the Eucharistic Prayer is called the Consecration. By the power of the Holy Spirit and through the words and actions of the priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is called transubstantiation. What looks like bread and wine is not bread and wine anymore. The bread and wine are now the Body and B lood of Christ. As Catholics we believe that Jesus Christ is really present in the Eucharist.

The priest invites us to proclaim our faith. We pray:

"When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again."

We pray that the Holy Spirit will unite all those who believe in Jesus. We end the Eucharistic Prayer by responding "Amen." We are saying "yes" to the prayer the priest has prayed in our name.

Eucharistic Prayer the most important prayer of the Mass

We pray the Our Father and ask God for forgiveness and peace.

After the Eucharistic Prayer, we prepare to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. We join ourselves with the whole Church. We pray the Our Father.

After the Our Father, the priest prays, "Peace I leave you, my peace I give you."

We pray that Christ's peace may be with us always. We offer a sign of peace to one another. This action shows that we are united to Christ and to one another.

Then we ask Jesus for forgiveness and peace:

"Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace."

As we pray the "Lamb of God," the priest breaks the Bread or Host that has become the Body of Christ.

Why do we share a sign of peace at Mass?





We receive Jesus Christ in Holy Communion.

After the "Lamb of God," the priest holds up the Host that has become the Body of Christ. He says,

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

We respond,

"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."

Then people go forward to receive Communion. The priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion shows the Host to each person and says, "The Body of Christ." Each person responds, "Amen" and receives Holy Communion.

Then the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion may hand the cup to each person saying, "The Blood of Christ." Each person responds, "Amen" and drinks from the cup.

We all sing a song of thanksgiving. Then there is quiet time. We thank Jesus for the gift of himself in Holy Communion.
