Dear Friends in Christ,

Accompanying this letter is our Parish Financial Report for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The report also includes a brief summary of different aspects of our parish ministry. The bottom line of our financial report is certainly good news! For the second time in four years, we are in the **BLACK**. Our total income for the past fiscal year was \$1,754,715 while our expenses totaled \$1,745,398. This put us in the **BLACK** by \$9,317!

This is truly remarkable considering all of the improvements which were completed on our buildings and grounds in the past year. Our solar panels on the roofs of the Rectory, Religious Ed Building and Parish Life Center (PLC) have been up and running since the end of June. Several of us on the parish staff can track the energy production with an app on our phones. It's amazing! By the time you receive this letter, we will have already had our close-out meeting with our solar company, Resonant Energy.

The entire exterior of the PLC was beautifully renovated this past winter. I spoke with a visitor recently who actually thought it was a new building! In addition to their regular monthly work, Pro-Brighter Landscaping weeded and placed wood chips on large areas of our property, including on Barbara St., Clara St. and at the Mary Shrine. They also took great care of our huge parking lots and outside stairs by plowing, salting and shoveling during the snow and ice threats of winter. Security cameras have been installed on our church property, one on the side of the church to cover the back parking lot, and others in the narthex and on the front of the church. A monitor for all of the cameras is housed in the church's work sacristy. This enables us to go back in time and check camera footage of any part of the substantial area covered by the cameras in the event of any unwanted incident on our property.

Perhaps you've noticed our beautiful new parish signs on Station Ave. Additional signage is now being completed to help direct people to our various buildings. I would like to thank our Facilities Manager, Pedro Souza, our Parish Pastoral Council and our Parish Finance Council for all of their input and assistance in bringing these improvements to fruition. But I would especially like to thank all of YOU for your exceptional generosity and commitment to St. Pius X Parish. Our First Grand Annual Appeal was a tremendous success, raising over \$130,000 for the parish. Our Women's Society raised over \$60,000 for the parish from their two parish fairs. Our collection income was up more than \$17,000 over last year, and up nearly \$21,000 over two years ago. And finally, several individuals thought to include St. Pius X Parish in their wills. We received a total of over \$217,000 in bequests from four separate estates during the past fiscal year, with one of them being \$199,000. Isn't that amazing? We also received \$109,000 from a government program called Employee Retention Credit (ERC) which rewards small businesses that kept employees on the payroll during COVID. Thanks to the Diocese of Fall River for encouraging all of its parishes and schools to apply for this program! All of these factors explain why we were able to stay in the BLACK, despite another year of substantial improvements to our buildings and property.

Once again, thank you so much for your exceptional generosity to St. Pius X Parish. You enable us to care for our buildings and grounds, and continue our beloved parish's work and ministry in an attractive and welcoming environment!
